The Flag flying from this site is flown in honor of Private Walter Norman Tischer for the month of April, 2021 by North Mankato American Legion Post 518.

Walter was born on October 26, 1930 to William and Ida Tischer in Rapidan, Minnesota. He attended school in Rapidan. On November 7, 1954, Walter was married to Edith Stursa at the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Mankato, Minnesota.

Walter made his living farming, and later working Swenson Concrete, Unimin Sand and at Mico in Mankato, Minnesota. After retiring, Walter ran a saw sharpening service and delivered papers for the Minneapolis Tribune.

He was a member of the LeSueur, Minnesota American Legion. Walter enjoyed playing dartball, sports memorabilia and woodworking.

Walter Tischer began service to his country by joining the US Army on February 5, 1952. He went to Camp Gordon, Georgia. He was trained as a signalman and served in the US Army Signal Corps.

Private Walter Norman Tischer passed away on July 9, 2019 at the Belle Plaine Lutheran Home. At the time of his death, Walter was survived by his: **Sons** – Norman, Marcus and Orville; **Grandchildren** – Orville W. Tischer, Nathan Tischer and Eli Yeoman; and 4 **Great Grandchildren**. He was also survived by his **Siblings** – Erwin (Rosie) Tischer, Elna Bohlke and LaVerne (Emily) Tischer.
